With the game evenly balanced heading in to day 2, rain intervened leaving Perth as the Premiers due to their higher ladder positioning.

- Michael Brown returns as overseas player and plays 8 games.
- Fransua Grobler, Chris Padovan and Chris Thompson arrive at South Peth

2007/08

- South Perth wins back to back Sunday League titles with it's eighth title, a win over Melville under lights at the WACA Ground
- Simon Allison and Christian Moir perform a swap of wicket keeping roles between Perth and South Perth
- Doug Wallis takes a hat trick in the 2nd Grade match on Australia Day 2008 against Subiaco-Floreat
- WACA Third Grade loses a semi-final to Bayswater-Morley played at Kingsway Reserve.
- Steve Barry assumes the Presidency of the club, replacing Wayne Andrews
- Chris Rogers plays his first Test Match, becoming the 399th test player for Australia (and sixth from South Perth)
- Ross Davenport wins the JP Robbins Medal for the 2nd Grade WACA Best and Fairest Player
- *U/13s side wins the premiership.*
- Darren Wates retires from First Grade Cricket
- Ian Waite awarded life membership of the South Perth Cricket Club

- Lorne Sprigg replaces Dennis Baker as club coach
- Hugh Brown takes over as the club captain from Darren Wates
- Will Owen and Michael O'Shea join the club for the summer from Glamorgan County Cricket Club
- Will Owen takes a double hat-trick against Perth in the Round 14 2nd Grade Match against Perth

- WACA third grade loses a semi-final for the second year in a row against Bayswater-Morley, this time at Hillcrest Reserve.
- WACA fourth grade advance to their first grand final since the premiership of 1995/96, narrowly going down to Joondalup in a tough encounter at Cresswell Park

- *U/14s side wins the premiership.*

- Fourth Grade avenges its defeat in the previous year's grand final with a tense win against Willetton at James Oval. Matthew Boardman wins player of the final.
- Adam Dibble joins the club as the overseas player for 2009/10
- Marshall Hood scores 204 in the opening match of the season against Claremont-Nedlands at Richardson Park, the second highest score in South Perth history
- *U/15's* side wins the premiership undefeated
- Kim Hagdorn, Tom Dawson and Gary Owens are awarded life membership of the South Perth Cricket Club

- Michael Beer and Marty Paskal agree to join South Perth upon moving to WA to further their cricket careers with the Western Australian state squad.
- Andy Gray agrees to join the club after an 8 year break from WACA cricket.
- Kim Hagdorn returns to the Club as a bowling coach after a 12 year absence.
- Alex Penter claims 9/71 in an outstanding display against his former club University at James Oval. Alex's haul includes that of his brother and former South Perth player Mark, Ibw for a duck.
- After just five first class matches for Western Australia, Michael Beer is selected as twelfth man for Australia for the 3rd and 4th tests against England at the WACA and the Melbourne Cricket Ground, before becoming Australia's 418th player to play test cricket after making his debut on 3 January 2011 in the 5th test at the Sydney Cricket Ground.
- South Perth wins the 7th Grade Suburban Turf (One-day) trophy mid
- South Perth's Women's team win both the A Grade premiership (the first for the club) as well as the B Grade 20/20 trophy for the season.
- South Perth wins a record 13th WACA Club Championship trophy. All four senior sides make the semi finals, with the second grade side progressing to the Grand Final.
- South Perth wins its first WACA Second grade premiership for 36 years, taking out the flag with a comprehensive victory against Scarborough at Iluka Reserve. The side is captained by Ross Davenport, with Jacob van Galen named as the player of the final for his four wicket haul.
- Jacob van Galen becomes only the third player in history to win the Charlie Bull medal for South Perth's Club Champion from outside the1st Grade side following his outstanding season with both the Bat and Ball. His performances included making 200 in the first game of the season against Gosnells at Richardson Park, as well as a 13 wicket match haul against Bayswater-Morley at Hillcrest Reserve.

- Lorne Sprigg resigns as coach at Christmas, with Kim Hagdorn stepping in as interim coach for the remainder of the season.
- South Perth go back to back in the 2nd grade, claiming a tense 3 wicket win in the Grand Final against Subiaco-Floreat at Richardson Park in one of the great games in recent memory. The side is led by Sam Hagdorn, and Antony Radunovich is named man of the match for his 11 wicket haul.
- South Perth wins its first 3rd Grade Grand Final since 1980/81 against Willetton at Richardson Park. The side is captained by Mark Bowler. Jordan Korol is named man of the match.

- Hilton Cartwright becomes South Perth's 36th First Class Representative, debuting against New South Wales at Blacktown.
- South Perth wins its fifth 4th Grade premiership, defeating Bayswater-Morley at Tompkins Park No. 2 on Easter Sunday. The side is captained by Ben Berthon-Jones, and Hayden Krieg is named Man of the Match.
- South Perth wins the U/17 premiership.
- South Perth wins their 3rd Colts premiership, captained by Jackson Dave, with Matt Chave named Man of the Match.

- David Baird resigns as club coach, replaced by Dirk Bevilaqua
- South Perth wins back to back U/17's premierships for the first time in club history
